Rural Municipality of Eldon No. 471

BYLAW No. 66

Pursuant to the provisions of the Direct Sellers Act, 1965, The Council of the Rural Municipality of Eldon No. 471, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

Any person who carries on the business of a direct seller within the Rural Municipality of Eldon No. 471 shall pay to the said Municipality the fee prescribed by the regulations under the Direct Sellers Act.

Applicants for Licence

1. A licence may, in the absolute discretion of the registrar, be refused to any person who has not been a resident of Saskatchewan for at least one year immediately prior to the date of application.

Licence Fees

2. For a licence as a vendor:
- (i) where no salesman will be appointed..... \$ 25.00
 - (ii) where up to 5 salesmen may be appointed..... 50.00
 - (iii) where over 5 salesmen may be appointed..... 100.00
3. For a licence as salesman..... 5.00

Municipal Fees

4. (1) The fees payable to municipalities shall be determined as herein provided.
(2) Licences shall be in four divisions, to be referred to as Division A, Division B, Division C and Division D.
(3) The fees for each licence year or part thereof shall be as follows:

Division A

Cities	
With 50,000 population or over.....	\$ 25.00
With 20,000 but under 50,000 population.....	20.00
Under 20,000 population.....	30.00
Towns.....	10.00
Village and Rural Municipalities.....	5.00

Division B

Cities	
With 50,000 population or over.....	\$ 50.00
With 20,000 but under 50,000 population.....	40.00
Under 20,000 population.....	30.00
Towns.....	20.00
Villages and Rural Municipalities.....	10.00

Division C

Cities	
With 50,000 population or over.....	\$ 75.00
With 20,000 but under 50,000 population.....	60.00
Under 20,000 population.....	45.00
Towns.....	30.00
Villages and Rural Municipalities.....	15.00

Division D

Cities	
With 50,000 population or over.....	\$100.00
With 20,000 but under 50,000 population.....	80.00
Under 20,000 population.....	60.00
Towns.....	40.00
Villages and Rural Municipalities.....	20.00

NOTE: Population to be based on most recent Dominion census.

- (4) A licence that authorizes the sale of photographs, furs or fur coats shall be in Division D.
 - (5) A licence that authorizes the sale of fruit, vegetables or meat shall be in Division C.
 - (6) A licence that authorizes the sale of other goods or services shall be in Division B, unless otherwise provided in subsection (7)
 - (7)(i) A licence that authorizes the sale of books of an educational nature shall be in Division A.
 - (ii) A licence that authorizes the sale of goods or services where the registrar is satisfied that the amount of sale or sales to any one customer does not ordinarily exceed \$100.00 shall be in Division A.
5. Notwithstanding Section 4, where the holder of a licence is a merchant selling in a municipality in which he has a recognized place of business in respect of which he pays a business tax or is a bona fide servant or employee of the merchant, the fee payable to the municipality shall be \$5.00
6. Where a person was the holder of a licence under the Commercial Agents Act, 1958, immediately prior to the coming into force of The Direct Sellers Act, 1965, such person shall be entitled to have any licence fee or municipal fee paid in respect of such licence apply to the licence fee or municipal fee payable under these regulations for the licence period expiring on March 31, 1966.
